RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF BOLIVAR, NEW YORK, ADOPTED AUGUST 21, 2012, APPROVING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF WATER DISTRICT NO. 1 AT THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST TO THE TOWN \$480,400, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH RESOLUTION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM

Recitals

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Bolivar (herein called the “Town”), in the County of Allegany, New York, has heretofore received and reviewed a map, plan and report prepared by Clark Patterson Lee, Engineers and Surveyors PC, competent engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, which report is dated

November 2011 and was prepared for the Village of Richburg, New York in contemplation of a proposed joint water system improvement project proposed to be constructed pursuant to an existing Intermunicipal Agreement between the Village of Richburg and the Village of Bolivar (collectively referred to herein as the “Villages”); and

WHEREAS, the improvements described in said map, plan and report include improvements located outside the boundaries of said Villages, but within the boundaries of the Town, for the purpose of improving and expanding the water service currently provided by the Villages to residents of the Town outside of the Villages; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed that the Town shall hereafter provide water service as a Town function in the area described herein, which area would be designated as Water District No. 1 (the “District”), pursuant to an Intermunicipal Agreement among the Town and the two Villages; and

WHEREAS, the two Villages have entered into an existing Intermunicipal Agreement for the provision of water service on a joint basis and it is expected that such Intermunicipal Agreement shall be amended to also include the Town; and

WHEREAS, the map, plan and report dated November 2011 has been duly filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town for public inspection; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Bolivar, as lead agent, has given due consideration to the impact that the project may have on the environment and on the basis of such consideration, the Village Board has determined that the project will not result in any large and important impacts and, therefore, will not have a significant impact to the environment, and no substantial adverse environmental impact will be caused thereby; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Bolivar has reviewed the determinations made by the Village of Bolivar, as lead agent, and the Town Board is in

agreement with the determinations made by the Village of Bolivar pursuant to SEQRA;
and

WHEREAS, the Town and the two Villages have complied in every respect with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations regarding environmental matters, including compliance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, comprising Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and, in connection therewith, a negative declaration has been prepared and executed; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Order adopted by the Town Board on August 7, 2012 and a notice duly published and posted pursuant to applicable provisions of the Town Law, a public hearing has been held on August 21, 2012 for the purpose of hearing those in favor of and those opposed to the establishment of the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, upon the evidence adduced at such Public Hearing,
be it

RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF
BOLIVAR, IN THE COUNTY OF ALLEGANY, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined that:

(a) the Notice of Public Hearing was published, posted and filed as required by Law, and it is otherwise sufficient;

(b) all the property and property owners included within the proposed District hereinabove referred to in the recitals hereof are benefited thereby;

(c) all the property and property owners benefited are included within the limits of the proposed District; and

(d) it is in the public interest to establish the District at the estimated maximum cost to the Town of \$480,400.

Section 2. The establishment of the District is hereby approved at the estimated maximum cost to the Town of \$480,400, and said District shall be designated and known as Water District No. 1, in the Town of Bolivar, and shall be bounded and described as follows: ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND situate in the Town of Bolivar, County of Allegany and State of New York, being more particularly described as follows:

Area 1: Beginning at a point being the Westerly corner of tax map parcel number 272.8-1-12 on the Village of Bolivar boundary, thence;

- i. Northeasterly along the northwesterly line of tax map parcel number 272.8-1-12 a distance of 175 feet, more or less, to the northerly corner of tax map parcel number 272.8-1-12; thence;
- ii. Northeasterly along the northwesterly line of tax map parcel number 272.8-1-14 a distance of 10 feet, more or less, to the northerly line of tax map parcel number 272.8-1-14; thence

- i. Westerly along the southerly line of tax map parcel number 259.20-1-84.1 a distance of 118 feet, more or less, to the southwesterly point of tax map parcel number 259.20-1-84.1; thence;
- ii. Northerly along the westerly line of tax map parcel number 259.20-1-84.1 a distance of 320 feet, more or less, to the southwesterly point of 259.20-1-84.1, thence;
- iii. Westerly along the southerly line of tax map parcel number 259.20-1-84.1 a distance of 89 feet, more or less, to the southwesterly point of 259.20-1-84.1; thence;

- x. Southerly along the Village of Bolivar boundary a distance of 69 feet, more or less, to the Point of Beginning.

Section 3. The maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of the joint project, including the portions to be paid for by the Village of Bolivar, the Village of

Richburg and the Town of Bolivar, is \$6,833,640 and the maximum amount proposed to be expended for construction of the Town's allocable local share is \$480,400, which is planned to be financed by grants from the United States of America and/or the State of New York, to the extent available, and the issuance of not to exceed \$480,400 serial bonds of the Town to finance the portion of the Town's share of the cost not covered by grant funds. The Town's share of the cost, including payment of principal of and interest on said bonds, shall be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land within the District which the Town Board shall deem especially benefited by said improvement, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon the same; and any grant funds received or to be received from the United States of America, and/or the State of New York and/or other applicable funding sources in connection with such project shall be applied towards the cost of said object or purpose or redemption of said bonds issued for such purpose, or shall be budgeted as an offset to the taxes for the payment of the principal and interest on said bonds.

Section 4. The permission of the State Comptroller is not required with respect to the establishment of the District because the estimated cost of the establishment of the District to the Typical Property (as defined in the Town Law and as stated in the Order Calling Public Hearing adopted on August 7, 2012) is not above the Average Estimated Cost to the Typical Properties for the establishment of similar types of districts, as computed by the State Comptroller, and the Town Clerk has filed a certified copy of the Order with the State Comptroller as required by the Town Law.

Section 5. This resolution is subject to a permissive referendum and the Town Clerk of the Town is hereby authorized and directed within ten (10) days after the adoption of said resolution, to cause to be published at least once in the "*Olean Times Herald*," a newspaper having general circulation in said Town, and hereby

designated the official newspaper of the Town, and posted on the sign board of the Town, maintained pursuant to subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law, a Notice which shall set forth an abstract of the foregoing resolution, which shall be in substantially the following form:

SECOND: RESOLVING AND DETERMINING that (a) the Notice of Public Hearing was published and posted as required by Law and is otherwise sufficient, (b) all the property and property owners within the District are benefited thereby, (c) all the property and property owners benefited are included within the limits of the District and (d) it is in the public interest to establish the District;

THIRD: APPROVING the establishment of the District; DESIGNATING the District as Water District No. 1; and DESCRIBING District by metes and bounds in a manner sufficient to identify the lands included therein;

FOURTH: RESOLVING that the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of the joint project, including the portions to be paid for by the Village of Bolivar, the Village of Richburg and the Town of Bolivar, is \$6,833,640 and the maximum amount proposed to be expended for construction of the Town's allocable local share is \$480,400, which is planned to be financed by grants from the United States of America and/or the State of New York, to the extent available, and the issuance of not to exceed \$480,400 serial bonds of the Town to finance the portion of the Town's share of the cost not covered by grant funds. The Town's share of the cost, including payment of principal of and interest on said bonds, shall be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land within the District which the Town Board shall deem especially benefited by said improvement, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon the same; and any grant funds received or to be received from the United States of America, and/or the State of New York and/or other applicable funding sources in connection with such project shall be applied towards the cost of said object or purpose or redemption of said bonds issued for such purpose, or shall be budgeted as an offset to the taxes for the payment of the principal and interest on said bonds;

FIFTH: STATING that permission of the State Comptroller is not required with respect to the District because the estimated cost of the District to the Typical Property (as defined in the Town Law) is not above the Average Estimated Cost to the Typical Properties for the establishment of similar types of districts, as computed by the State Comptroller; and

SIXTH: STATING that this resolution is subject to a permissive referendum.
