Highway:

• Superintendent Schiralli gave his report to the Board to review. They have been working on Horse Run, Scott Hollow and Phillips Hill roads this month. They also worked on the new highway building, tying gutter drains into storm drains and working on the oil separator. Items that still need to be discussed for the new building are the electric, lighting, doors, and a heating system. The Town will be plowing Co. Rt. 40 and the transfer station this year.
