## 9. **REPORT OF TOWN OFFICIALS:**

- **Highway:** Highway Superintendent Brad Schiralli gave his report to the Board.  
The Towns new JCB backhoe has arrived. The 2014 JCB Backhoe arrived with 645 hours on it. There is one issue I am trying to iron out with the salesperson on this backhoe? New batteries, and different back digging bucket than what we had received.  
Been working in the shop on rainy days, getting plows fitted to the trucks and sanders ready for the up-and-coming winter plow season.  
Other road projects the highway department has been working on are: cleaning ditches and grading shoulders on the McKee Road the entire length from route 417 to the town of Alma town line: cleaning ditches in grading shoulders on the white Hill Road the entire length from route 417 to the town of Alma line.  
Town employees fixed the dog kennel dividers.  
All full-time Highway employees has taken the sexual harassment training October 12th.  
2012 Dodge 3/4-ton pickup is now on Tietsworth auction site. The bidding will start tonight at 6:00 p.m. and end Tuesday October 25th 6:00 p.m. if anyone is interested in bidding?  
The Board and Highway Superintendent Schiralli discussed what to do with the 98 backhoe, since the Town purchased the 2014 JCB backhoe. After a little discussion, they agreed to post the backhoe on the Teitsworth auction site.  
Mr. Schiralli also updated the Board with the truck mileage/equipment hours.

- **Code Enforcement-** No report for September submitted. There were 2 building permit applications in September: Button-448 Horse Run-32x32 covered patio; Schweickert-Stoney Lonesome Rd-14x24 cabin.

The code position is still available. Mr. Schiralli stated he was interested in taking the position but he and the Board had some questions. They discussed the duties of both highway superintendent and code enforcement. Mr. Schiralli stated that he would like to try and be the code enforcement officer as well.

On a motion made by Councilperson Iantorno, seconded by Councilperson MacDonell, the board appointed Bradley Schiralli as the new code enforcement office to take effect November 1, 2022. Aye – 3, Nay – 1, Absent – 1. Motion carried.

- **Town Clerk:** The Clerk report for September was handed out to the board. Check #2014 for \$4,174.96 was deposited in the General A Fund. Check #2015 for \$150.00 was deposited in the General B Fund. Also issued by the clerk's Office were 2 permanent handicap permits and 5 notarized documents.

- 2023 Budget: The Board will meet on a separate day to go over the budget if need. The public hearing is set for November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 6pm.
- Cemetery complaint – Mr. Putnam was present at the meeting and discussed with the board any complaints.
- Snow and Ice contract with Allegany County: The Town received the proposed Snow and Ice contract from Allegany County. The Board looked it over and approved the contract by resolution.
